**4. First aid****4.1 General indications:**

Never provide drink or induce vomiting in the event of loss of consciousness.

**4.2 Inhaling:**

Take the person out into the fresh air. In the event of suffocation, proceed to provide artificial respiration.

**4.3 Contact with the skin:**

Wash with plenty of water. Remove contaminated clothing.

**4.4 Eyes:**

Wash with plenty of water (for at least 15 minutes), keeping eyelids open. Seek medical assistance.

Drink large amounts of water. Avoid vomiting. Seek medical assistance. Administer a solution of medical-usage active charcoal. Stomach lavage. Laxatives: sodium sulphate (1 soup-spoonful in 250 ml of water). Administer Vaseline oil as a laxative (3 ml/kg).
